

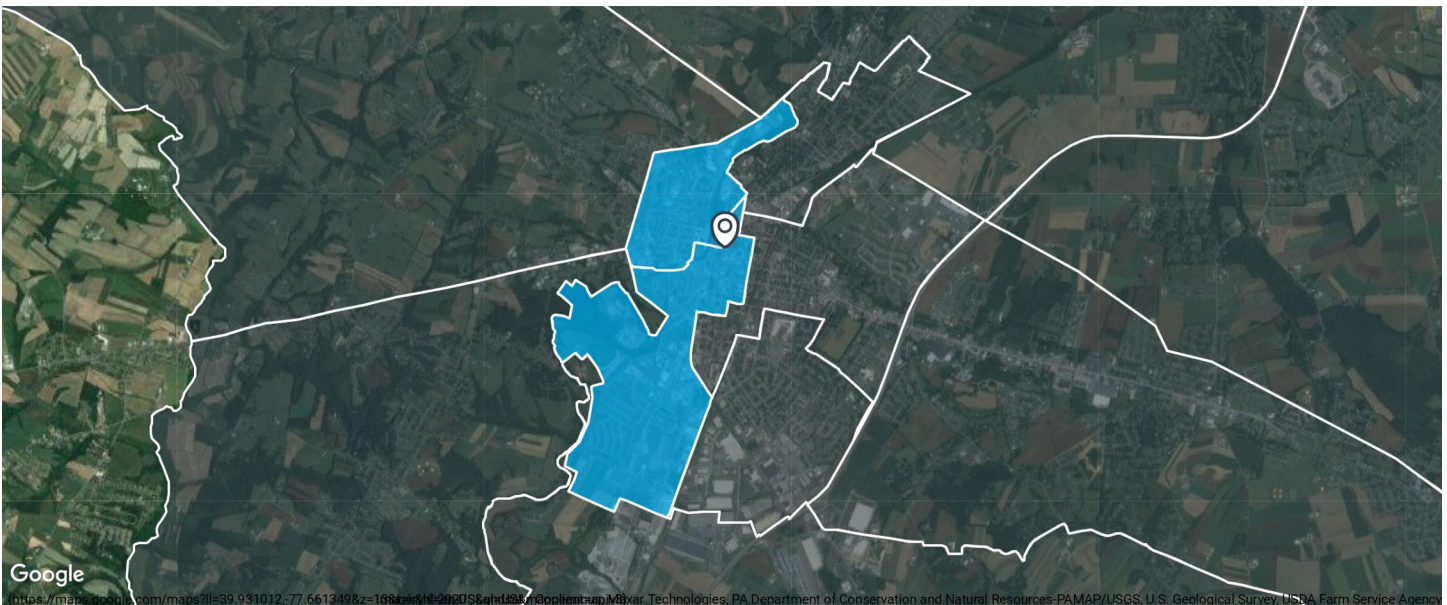
Opportunity zones and New Markets Tax Credits (NMTC) interactive map
